# **PCS52.24 MINUTES**

# **PCS53.24 MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES**

<u>Parking in Charmouth PCS43.24a</u> Cllr Martin Sayers discussed this with Cllr Belinda Bawden at the last Full Council about Speedwatch this does not accord with DC policy as shown in <a href="https://www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/w/20-mile-per-hour-mph-policy">https://www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/w/20-mile-per-hour-mph-policy</a>.

The relevant bit is: An active CSW team should be in place for at least 12 months. It is recognised that on rare occasions some communities may have demonstratable difficulties with establishing a team and these difficulties would not on their own prevent an application being considered. This is to demonstrate a clear commitment from within the community. If, after 12 months there is still a wish to request a 20mph scheme the town or parish council should be able to demonstrate wide community support for the proposed 20mph scheme. This can be achieved by carrying out a survey of residents and /or holding public meetings. It is important that there is a high level of community support as the installation of any 20mph scheme will involve a statutorily required period of formal public consultation costing a maximum of £1000 (cost of two public adverts). If we are serious about getting 20 mph here it needs a champion to work on getting a survey of residents started to gauge opinion. This is essential if we want to apply without Speedwatch.

#### **PCS54.24 PROGRESS REPORTS**

# a) Parking in Double Common

A letter was sent to all residents to ask their views on initiating a Residents Only Parking Permit scheme. Most of the residents were against this idea but were in favour of approaching Dorset Council to ask if double yellow lines could be considered on the bends from Hammonds Mead into Double Common and on the bend by the footpath at the side of the school. It was proposed to take this to the Full Council meeting in February to be decided.

# b) Scout path lights

It was decided that the lights were adequate on the path to the scout hut. The committee agreed that if they get broken or stop working in the future to look at a solution then.

- (i) Parking Still an ongoing issue and is being monitored. Two planters have been installed in front of the gates and have now been planted out.

# a) Holes in the walls at The Pavilion and damaged bench
